Public Hearing – Finance: Hold a public hearing on the Proposed Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Operating Budget.

3. **Discuss/Act – Sanitation: Ordinance 1st Reading - Collection Charges:** Consider an ordinance amending Ordinance No. 17-05 passed by City Council on September 21, 2017, providing for the collection and disposal of garbage and trash with the City of Bronte, Texas by revising **Section F** by the increase of collection charges. New adopted 18-05 ordinance will replace 17-05.

Stormy Vaughn asked about the breakdown of charges. Why do commercial customers get charge a different rate versus residential customers when it is the same polycart? Do dumpster commercial rate customers also get charged for commercial water and sewer?
