11. Discuss/Act – Community Development: Depot – Update - Consider what to do with the Depot Ricky Royall presented slide show of pictures of areas at the depot that need attention. Recommendation to work roof and foundation. Contact historical foundation to get information and see if someone could attend the next council meeting to educate council and city staff how to go about repairs to the Depot.

13. **Discuss/Act – Community Development:** - Consider hiring grant writing and administrative service for the Texas Community Development Block Grant Program TxCDBG. Bids were sent out and one replied to the RFP. Consider accepting Municipal Consulting Agency as our administrator for the TxCDBG program.

Mayor Gohman would like the grant to be used to update the water treatment plant. If we get the grant, we can use the money from the water debt fund to replace some of our water line. Stormy Vaughn made a motion to hire Municipal Consulting Agency as our administrator for the TxCDBG program, seconded by David Bedford.

Vote: 4-0 motion passed

14. Discuss/Act – Utilities: Update - Reviewing of Water Supply Contract with City of Robert Lee and City of Bronte and Wholesale Treated Water Supply Agreement with Upper Colorado River Authority - UCRA, City of Robert Lee and City of Bronte. Both contracts are from 2011.

Discussion on this matter: (1) if Robert Lee goes over their 200K gallons a day allotment of water, then a \$.30 increase per 1K gallons would be charged; or (2) An overage rate or fine should be collected of the rate of the base water charge, instead of \$2.50 per 1K gallons (lake water current rate), we would charge the \$4.76 per 1K gallons (current base rate for well water); or (3) We just write a warning letter saying you have been going over the 200K gallons of water and give Notice stating "Try not to go over it (200k gallons) again".

Bronte has ordered a new \$3,100 water meter to be installed for accuracy measuring water sold to Robert Lee. Mayor Gohman states that the old meter is about 90% effective because so much pressure of water runs through it daily. The meter would actually run slower through the years. This meter is the original meter and was installed in 2011. We are doing our due diligence by installing this new meter and it will pay for itself. Council discussed, we can charge an overage rate (fine that is much higher than the normal rate) or charge them a minimal overage rate. If we allow Robert Lee to go over 200k gallons a day at a minimal rate, they could "open the valve" and we would have zero control over the water supplied or have no limit set on the water they use or sell. It was suggested that we either stick with the 200k gallon limit or go with the higher rate as an overage charge. It was also discussed that any overage rate would be calculated on a monthly basis and not daily for easier billing purposes; being the number of gallons per day, multiplied by thirty days. If we allow more than 200k gallons a day, we will have to amend the Contract, and have it recorded. If the current meter is wrong and it is fast, we are replacing the meter with a new one. Bronte has not charged Robert Lee any higher rate for water they used over 200k gallons a day, charged on a monthly basis, Robert Lee will be billed said amount as an overage rate.

David Bedford made a motion that the City of Bronte charge 50% over our rate for lake water and 50% over our rate for well water in the event Robert Lee goes over the 200K gallons a day on a monthly basis, seconded by Stormy Vaughn.

Vote: 3 for and 1 held vote (Lee Wommack), motion passed.

Stormy Vaughan added a 90-day notice will be given of the effective date.

Ricky Royall recommends sending old meter to factory to be re-calibrated, repaired, and then changed out every couple of years.

Mayor Gohman opened public hearing for Curfew Ordinance at 7:55pm December 20, 2018 for discussion.

Discuss/Act - Ordinance: Texas Gov't Transportation Code Chapter 396 - Auto Wrecker/Salvage Yards
 Consider and take action. Council has reviewed Texas Gov't Transportation Code Chapter 396 - Auto
 Wrecker/Salvage Yards.

Discussion that currently, the City will handle this situation internally through the Public Nuisance Ordinance. A demand letter will be written to any properties that are out of compliance. A monthly or routine check on the properties will be done to avoid this condition in the future. If the Public Nuisance Ordinance internally does not work and payment of fines are not collected, then the Department of Transportation will be contacted.

New committee has been appointed. New members being Ricky Royall-Fire Marshall, Santiago RodriguezCity Council, and Bob Bailey-citizen, to serve as the at large member to the board of appeals

20. Discuss/Act – Cemetery: Consider what to do with cemetery land Request for Council to trade 22.7 acres of land by the cemetery (in which City of Bronte has interest) for a 0.94 acre of land near the cemetery. Discussion by Council that City of Bronte cannot facilitate said request. Mayor Gohman stated that the entire 22.7 acres is in a flood plain and does not see a city use for the property. The 0.94 acre tract of land would be great to purchase and maybe have a graveside pavilion added as a service and an accommodation for the citizens.

Discussion by Council regarding 2.33 acres of land behind the current cemetery that was deeded to the City by the Barbee family years ago. Terms of donation state City of Bronte would need to put a

monument up as dedication. Requested monument would cost \$6,500.00. The City sewer line runs through the 2.33 acres of land. The sewer line could be found with a road over the sewer line and other area would be graves. If we were to build a pavilion for graveside services, the location of the 0.94 acre would be a great location since it is so close to the cemetery. Mayor to contact Ms. Barbee explaining our options other than the requested monument as dedication, such as a plaque or a plaque on the pavilion with acknowledgment to Barbee family.

Councilman, David Bedford left the council meeting at 8:25pm for another business meeting.

Mayor tabled until more research is done. Update at next council meeting.

 - a. Water rate is based off of the size of the meter / size of the line. The line size determines the size of the meter which determines the rate.
 - b. Sewer rate residential is low rate. Commercial rates are little bit higher because more waste goes into the sanitary sewer and more of a load and higher to treat.

City Secretary Report

Auditing the utility billing, we are not charging customers for delivery and removal of trash dumpsters properly. A charge of \$45 to deliver and \$45 to remove a dumpters needs to be added to an Amended

Ordinance and start charging the customer. Water ordinance lists a \$27.50 charge to turn water off and additional \$27.50 to turn it back on. Currently we do not charge, but we need to.

Utility Director Report

Ricky Royall reported on code enforcements 12 closed nuisances and 16 still working on. Would like to start taking old meters to sale them as brass in San Angelo.
