Council discussed City of Robert Lee's proposal. After a lengthy discussion, there are two options -

1) go with the amendment and rate Bronte has presented or

2) accept the proposal from Robert Lee's negotiation with a lower overage rate and wait until October as the effective date. The original contract states Robert Lee cannot go over the 200K gallons of water a day. Bronte's proposal was to charge an overage rate, only on any excess of water over the 200k of water a day, calculated on a monthly basis.

Stormy Vaughn made a motion deny City of Robert Lee revised rate and terms and keep with our amendment, seconded by David Bedford.

15. Discuss/Act – Utilities: - Update - Consider amending container information on Sanitation Ordinance 18-05 to Section F -Collection Charges to charge the current rate deliver and pickup fee of 2y, 4y, 6y and 8y containers shall be charged \$45 for delivery and \$45 for pickup.

Stormy Vaughn made a motion to charge the current rate for deliver and pickup fee at the current rate in the ordinance effectively immediately, seconded by David Bedford.

Ricky Royall also asked if fees could start when signs are posted, and city hall does advertising.

34. Discuss – Mayors Report: Goals and projects

Mayor Gohman reports trying to fix the roads and getting help from the county they are still buried fixing their county roads from all the rain. One of the options, one to bring in the road base and then bring in the maintainer to get it out. If we could get the road base in, then all they would need to find is a couple of extra hours to bring the maintainer over. We have the option to using one of their dump trucks and operated by us and we would pay the fuel. It takes five loads to do a block. Then asked if they could bring the maintainer over it. That would not impact the budget much. This is an option to get it going now.

Mayor Gohman reports that Stormy Vaughn emailed me and wanted to bring up some safety issues with sea containers. They are made to be air tight. If someone uses for storage and puts a lawn mower, weed eater, anything with gasoline (even 1 liter of gasoline) gas fumes build up. Then you have a structure fire right next to a sea container, you have a giant bomb in someone's back yard. Studies have shown the containers to explode and injure fire fighters and citizens. It's an issue I haven't thought of. It's an issue we need to look at, it's a safety issue for the fire department and a safety issue for people. I don't think you can regulate what people put in them, but we need to make sure it's ventilated. Mayor suggested to look and see what other cities are doing and see if they are ordinances on it, then go back through and require citizens to retrofit their stuff to be ventilated as a safety issue.

The engineers have requested to come and talk to us about options for our water plant. We need to do maintenance, but we want to do smart maintenance. They will at next meeting, and they will show us what the options are.

City Secretary Report -

At next council meeting I will cancel the election

Stormy Vaughn asked if we will be charged for voting equipment. I will find out if the county will still be invoicing the city.

Utility Director Report -

Ricky reports the inmates are scheduled to be here starting in April for their six-month cycle.
