Budget Workshop, Public Hearing Budget and Tax, Special City Council Meeting Minutes
Tuesday, September 7, 2021

The City Council of the City of Bronte, Texas met in special session Tuesday, September 7, City Council Chambers, City Hall, 114 S. Washington Street, Bronte, Texas. An audio recording requested through the Public Information Act through City Hall.

Mayor Paul Gohman called the City Council Meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and a quorum established. In attendance were Mayor Gohman, Mayor Pro Tem Gwen Dyess, Council Members Kinley Pritchard, Clabe F. Webb, Zach Davidson, and RA Morris. Staff members present Teresa Ballard and Ricky Royall.

Mayor Paul Gohman led with the Pledge of Allegiance and Kinley Pritchard led prayer.

AGENDA:

Council discussed the proposed Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2021-2022. Mayor Gohman tabled budget workshop and opened Public Hearing at 5:45 p.m. to hear citizens comments regarding the Proposed Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Operating Budget. There were no citizens comments and Mayor Gohman closed the public hearing at 5:46 p.m.

Mayor opened the Public Hearing at 5:50 p.m. to hear citizens comments regarding the proposed Tax Rate for Fiscal Year 2021-2022. There were no citizens comments and Mayor Gohman closed the public hearing at 5:51 p.m.

Mayor Gohman call the Special City Council Meeting to order at 5:52 p.m.


Kinley Pritchard made the motion to approve the Ordinance #21-05 Fiscal Year Operating Budget beginning October 1, 2021, and ending September 30, 2022, of the as presented. This budget will raise more revenue from property taxes than last year's budget by an amount of \$3,384, which is a one cent per \$100 tax increase from last year's budget, Gwen Dyess seconded the motion. Vote: 5-0, motion passed.

Zach Davidson made the motion to approve Ordinance #21-06 Levying Ad Valorem Taxes for the maintenance and support of the Municipal Government General Fund of the City of Bronte for Fiscal Year 2021-2022; that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of \$0.409373, which is a one cent per \$100 tax increase from last year's budget, RA Morris seconded the motion. Vote: 5-0 motion passed.

With no further business council adjourn at 5:53 p.m.
