

Restoring Bronte Foundation ("RBF") is celebrating ten years of Bronteoberfest this year! It has been an amazing ten years of raising money for not only our Park but also our Bronte Volunteer Fire Department. This event started small but has turned into a huge annual event for the small town of Bronte. People come from far and wide to participate and visit.

We had a big year nine last year. We almost doubled our revenue and were able to pour over \$35,000 into our little community. Coming off of such a successful event last year, we are looking forward to what year ten will bring. We are planning a larger scale celebration for our tenth year anniversary. Cory Morrow will be our headliner this year and is sure to bring a crowd. We also have local talent as opening acts, including Zack McGinn from Sterling City and the Kickapoo Creek Band from Coke County.

RBF continues to see growth with Bronteoberfest as we had over fifty cook-off teams in both 2022 and 2023 after having twenty-nine teams in 2021, and we have fifty teams registered already as of today. If we had thirty teams registered in August the last few years, we were thrilled; therefore, we expect a BIG year and the need to cap teams. We are now officially the biggest cook-off in the area, with quite a few sanctioned teams participating (i.e., well recognized teams that compete yearly for national championships.) RBF is so proud of this and wants to continue this momentum going into year ten! Our goal each year with Bronteoberfest is to have enough sponsorship money to cover all event expenses so that every wristband ticket we sell to the general public is profit, so this is where we could use your help. We feel strongly that overall Bronteoberfest is huge for our little community. Not only does it profit yearly, helping our causes, but more importantly it is a positive marketing tool for Bronte. Bronte is lucky enough to be sitting in the middle of two larger cities. Another goal of this event is to draw visitors from both San Angelo and Abilene. If more people visit and enjoy their time here, then there is more potential for future growth in Bronte.

RBF would greatly appreciate the same support from both EDC boards that we received last year, being \$5,000 from each board. Both EDC boards can make an impact by financially supporting this event yearly while we do the volunteer work involved. It is a partnership that we think works for everyone. 


